The School

Northwest College of the Bible conducts its classes in the facilities of Central Christian Church in Portland, Oregon. It is a cooperative effort of evangelists, elders and teachers of the northwest working together under the oversight of the elders of Central Christian Church. College level courses are offered to both men and women for the strengthening of the churches and preparation for full time ministries. We are pleased that you are considering God's work in your future and hope that NCB can play an important role in helping you achieve your goals.

The Purpose

The Purpose of Northwest College of the Bible is to equip Christians for ministry in their local congregations, prepare Christians for missionary work in the world, and help Christians develop the skills and character traits necessary for leadership in the Lord's Church. Ephesians 4:11-13 and 2 Timothy 2:2 indicate that this should be accomplished through the cooperative efforts of the evangelists, pastors, and teachers of the local congregations. God wants all Christians to continue to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Accreditation and Degrees

Northwest College of the Bible is not accredited by an accrediting association. However, NCB is certified by the state of Oregon to offer the following degrees: a two year Associate of Sacred Literature, a four year Bachelor of Sacred Literature, and a five year Bachelor of Theology. We have been successfully equipping young men and women for service in the Lord's church since 1952. Our high academic level is comparable to other Bible colleges, and most secular colleges and universities accept our credits for continuing education. Many of today's Godly and successful preachers have come from this school. The teachers at NCB hold academic degrees in ministry, missions, sacred literature or theology. They have been involved in several years of successful ministry. And all of the teachers are active leaders or ministers in local Christian Churches or Churches of Christ.

Tuition

The cost to attend NCB is much lower than most Bible colleges. Our professors are ministers and elders from local congregations. They donate their ministry time to teach in the Bible college. Students must place their fellowship with one of the supporting churches. Students are expected to be active in the work of their congregation, tithe, and maintain at least a C grade average. Tuition is \$15 for each four-credit hour class on campus. Students can audit classes for free.

Orientation Day

Orientation Day is Tuesday, August 26, 2014.

The first hour of this day is devoted to getting acquainted with the faculty, the school, and fellow students. All full-time students are required to attend this function.

Course Descriptions

TH 107 New Testament Church

Instructor: Dave Brink

This is an in-depth study of what the Bible teaches about the church, and of necessity, the contrast between the New Testament church and various denominations.

MN 101 Men's Personal Development

Instructor: Dave Brink

This course explores what the Bible teaches about Christian manhood. It helps us to develop and understand the spiritual disciplines and character traits that will enrich our relationships with God and the people we serve.

MN 103 Women's Personal Development

Instructors: Tammy Adams and Stephanie Kennedy This course places a strong emphasis on personal accountability and spiritual formation. Students will study Christian womanhood, spiritual disciplines, and other subjects that bring success and fulfillment to the Christian woman.

MN 201 Christian Education

Instructor: Mike Kennedy

One of the most important functions of the church lies in the area of education. This class explores creative and effective methods for teaching biblical truth.

LG 401 Advanced Greek

Instructor: Mike Kennedy

In Advanced Greek students will study Greek syntax. Students will also read and translate several passages from the Greek New Testament. First year Greek is a prerequisite for this class.

NT 205 Prison Epistles

Instructor: Justin Brink

This is a study of the letters Paul wrote during his first Roman imprisonment: Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon. These books contain some of the most important passages in the New Testament for doctrine and practical Christian living.

NT 207 1 & 2 Thessalonians and James

Instructor: Dave Adams

Thessalonians deals with such subjects as the return of Christ. James carries us into the benefits of trials, faith and works, the tongue, and other practical aspects of Christian living.

NT 209 1 & 2 Peter, 1, 2, & 3 John and Jude

Instructor: David Adams

The epistles of 1 and 2 Peter contain important instructions about holy living, husbands and wives, persecution and perseverance, false teachers and the end times. The epistles of John and Jude teach us about Christian love, sin and forgiveness, truth and error and our assurance of salvation.

OT 304 Old Testament Prophets (parts 1 & 2)

Instructor: Mike Kennedy

The prophets tell the story of the destruction of Jerusalem, the captivity in Babylon, and the return and rebuilding of the New Jerusalem. These books also describe the coming of the Messiah and Church He would establish.

OT 102 Old Testament Survey (parts 1 & 2)

Instructor: Joel Adams

This is a basic overview of the 39 books of the Old Testament. Attention will be given to how the Old Testament should be studied and the relevance it has for Christians today. Part 1 goes from Genesis to Esther. Part 2 goes from Job to Malachi.
